Eradicating the School-to-Prison Pipeline Foundation, Inc. (E-SToPP) is a 501(c)(3) non-profit corporation created and existing under the Laws of the State of Florida dedicated to eradicating the school to prison pipeline throughout Miami-Dade's most economically marginalized communities by creating a grassroots network of transformative racially equitable schools and educational opportunities for underserved and unserved youth, by laying the groundwork for a seamless sustainable reentry navigation route for students who have been isolated through exclusionary school discipline, referral, suspension, expulsion, and/or incarceration.
